Children and their families received a range of mental health and social services for the year ending June 30, 2016.

Adolescents and their families were treated in VISTA DEL MAR's Psychiatric Residential Treatment Programs that included a homelike living environment, individualized counseling, psychiatric care, therapeutic recreational activities, access to religious and cultural diversity programs, vocational assessment and training and schooling.

Children diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and other special needs experienced the joy of embracing their abilities in a program designed to encourage friendships and a sense of belonging.

Children, adults and families received individual, couples, family and group counseling to address a broad range of issues, including behavior problems, anxiety, depression, relationship difficulties. loss and bereavement, substance abuse, sexuality, career changes, life transitions, illness and disability, separation and divorce, and parenting.

Children and their families received prevention and early intervention services that are comprehensive, intensive and shaped to fit the needs of each individual family to reduce parental and familial stress and help them become more self-sufficient emotionally and more integrated into the community.

Clinical professionals attended the REISS DAVIS CHILD STUDY INSTITUTE: Graduate Center, Fellowships, and Continuing Education programs where they mastered techniques to diagnose and treat children and families experiencing mild to severe emotional, behavioral, and/or learning problems.

Children and families were served in our International Adoption, Domestic Adoption, Foster Care and Foster Adoption programs. We are dedicated to helping adults build their families. We are also there for children infants, toddlers and adolescents - without a safe or stable environment in which to thrive or grow. We also help Birth Parents make the best choice for themselves and their child. Trained social workers are there every step of the way to understand what options are available and to offer professional guidance throughout the process. Post-adoption Services and Parent Support Groups help the families face the inevitable challenges within a supportive environment.

Children and their families received SCHOOL-BASED SERVICES on site at several elementary, middle and high schools throughout Los Angeles, providing direct services to children and their families, as well as providing consultation to teachers and school-site administrators, parent education, teacher training other support services.

Children and their families received services provided by FAMILY SERVICE OF SANTA MONICA through the Santa Monica-Malibu Union School District, including individual and family counseling, parent education, teacher consultation and crisis intervention. Special programs also address issues relating to trauma and its relationship to academic success. Early Intervention Programs are offered to strengthen families with pre-school aged children and provide support for education professionals. Reflective Parenting Programs are offered to families at risk to help build the parent-child relationship.

Students identified with learning disabilities or developmental challenges, together with those experiencing social, emotional, behavioral or other developmental issues, attended classes at the VISTA SCHOOL to help meet their special needs while encouraging them to grow emotionally and academically. The educational and clinical staff create an atmosphere of success, taking into account the personal challenges in a child's life so they can have a positive school experience.

Wraparound program as an alternative to out-of-home care. Child and Family Teams link children, families and their support networks with child welfare, health, mental health, educational and juvenile justice service resources to develop comprehensive support and service plans that enable these vulnerable children to live in their communities.
